▲ FROM

- I don't **communicate regularly** (or at all) with the sender of the email.
- Not somebody in my organisation and wouldn't be relevant to me anyway.
- The email is from someone inside the organisation but the email seems unusually rewritten.
- I don't recognise the domain, or it looks just a bit "wrong" (e.g. Amazonhelp.com).
- I don't know the person who sent the email, nor does anybody else I work with.
- I've **never done business** with the sender, or ever spoken to them.
- Although I do know this person, I have not spoken to them for a long time and it **seems odd** for them to contact me

▲ ТО

- I don't know anyone else on the list of people CCd, and some of them are not even in my organisation.
- My name is **not mentioned** in the To or CC, or there are **multiple** variations of my name CCd. Eg. james@.. jim@.., jamie@..



CEO

- The subject line **seems not to match** the contents of the message.
- The **subject line** is inflammatory. threatening or asks me to act fast for something i know nothing about.
- It seems to be a **reply to an email I** don't remember, or have no proof of sending.

ATTACHMENTS

- The email has an attachment which doesn't correlate with the contents/ subject of the message.
- The attachment is **not of a format** I would expect to recieve from the sender.
- The sender never usually sends attachments.

DATE

I received this **out of regular hours!**

A CONTENT

- The sender is **strongly encouraging** me to click the link, and wouldnt usually do so.
- There are **spelling/grammar errors**, or it seems poorly worded in some way.
- The attachment or link I am being asked to open/click **doesn't seem related** to the theme of the email.
- I just feel uncomfortable about clicking the link, something seems wrong...
- The sender is saying they have compromising images/videos of me which I know to be untrue and thev will show others if I don't act.

HYPERLINK

- The URL in the link does NOT go to the website I think it should. This is the biggest alarm bell, DELETE IMMEDIATELEY.
- The email just contains a link and **no** other content.
- The URL/link appears to be **misspelt**, for example, a 1 instead of an I.
